Great Basin Connectivity and Climate Change Workshop 15 November 2010, 10:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M. University of Nevada, Reno

Content: The Great Basin Science Delivery Project in collaboration with the Great Basin Connectivity Working Group will host a full-day workshop at the University of Nevada, Reno on maintaining connectivity in the region as land use and climate change. A multidisciplinary team of agency and university researchers will present assessments of current connectivity of riparian vegetation and of habitat for animals including Greater Sage-Grouse, other native birds, and American Pronghorn. The team also will present projections of connectivity for multiple species of animals and plants under different scenarios of environmental change. Presenters will include Brett Dickson (Northern Arizona University), David Dobkin (High Desert Ecological Research Institute), Erica Fleishman (University of California), Steve Knick (U.S. Geological Survey), Mike Pellant (Bureau of Land Management), and others.

There will be ample time for discussion. Participants will be encouraged to provide feedback on additional scenarios and species most relevant to their planning and decision-making. For more information on content please contact Erica Fleishman (fleishman@bren.ucsb.edu).
